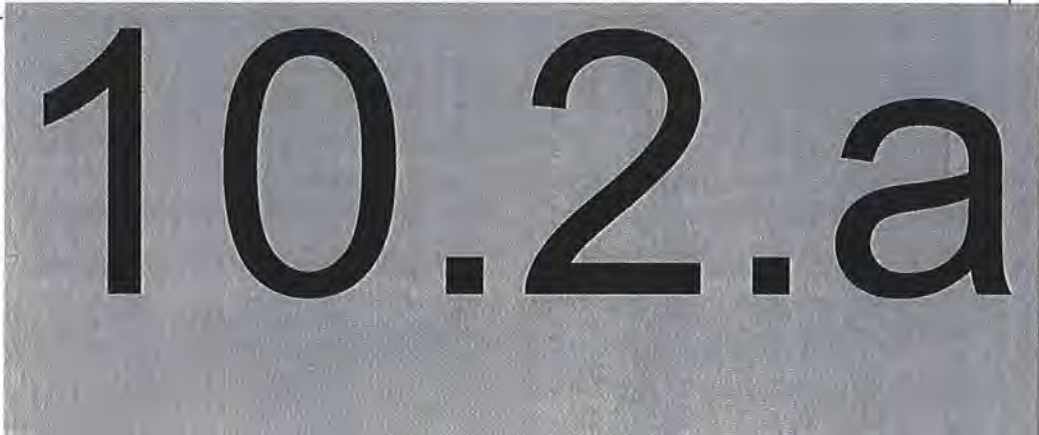
Onderwerp: Informatie over aankomende EU voorzitterschap door Duitsland en algemeen EU	
Kernboodschap	• Could you elaborate on Germany's priorities for your upcoming presidency? Moreover, are their changes in your priorities because of Covid-19? • How can the Netherlands support you during the presidency? • We work together on the European Health Data Space, a visionary and yet very concrete idea that should accelerate health research. COVID-19 might have overturned the format of your plans to move forward in Europe on this issue, the drive in the Netherlands to be part of your preparations on this has not decreased, on the contrary.
Argumentatie	<u>Duitse voorzitterschap</u> • Duitsland bekleedt de 2^e helft van 2020 het voorzitterschap van de EU Raad. • Duitsland is als grote en ervaren lidstaat een belangrijke factor. Het Duits voorzitterschap zal (volgens de oorspronkelijke inzet) aandacht besteden aan een aantal prioriteiten op het terrein van VWS. Duitsland zal zich daarbij met name richten op digitalisering (Big Data en Kunstmatige Intelligentie) en geneesmiddelen tekorten. Spahn nodigde minister Bruins uit voor een conferentie over digitalisering in Berlijn op 11 november 2020. • Gezien de voortdurende pandemie zal Duitsland ook een rol nemen voor de aanpak en coördinatie van de crisis. <u>Inzet Nederland</u> • Nederland denkt graag actief mee met Duitsland op specifieke onderwerpen, bijvoorbeeld op het gebied van de Covid-19 crisis, maar ook digitalisering en gegevensuitwisseling (b.v. grensoverschrijdende interoperabiliteit van de contact tracing apps NL en DE). • De European Health Data Space (EHDS), een belangrijk onderdeel van de agenda onder het Duits voorzitterschap, betreft het onder voorwaarden benaderbaar en toegankelijk maken van gezondheidsdata. Nederland biedt derhalve Duitsland aan hen te blijven steunen in een zorgvuldige ontwikkeling van EHDS (een gezamenlijke workshop is actueel opgeschort vanwege corona). • Nederland is daarnaast al jaren actief in de discussie over het EU farma system. Vanwege de coronacrisis zijn bestaande uitdagingen rondom geneesmiddelen alleen maar groter geworden. Zo zijn er uitdagingen met beschikbaarheid (tekorten/afhankelijkheid van beperkt aantal productieplaatsen), toegankelijkheid (nieuwe geneesmiddelen zijn niet in alle landen beschikbaar voor de patiënt) en betaalbaarheid (hoge prijzen voor nieuwe geneesmiddelen, waardoor het systeem niet duurzaam is).

Feiten & cijfers	<i>TER INFO: Laatste informele videoconferentie EU-gezondheidsministers, 12 mei:</i> • Het Kroatisch voorzitterschap nodigde uit tot een discussie over de beschikbaarheid van geneesmiddelen - met een focus op tekorten - als gevolg van de huidige pandemie en als inbreng voor de Europese geneesmiddelenstrategie, die momenteel opgesteld wordt. • Gezien het grensoverschrijdende karakter van het dossier, is Europese samenwerking onontbeerlijk. De kwetsbaarheden die zijn ontstaan door de concentratie van fabrieken voor de productie van (grondstoffen voor) geneesmiddelen in derde landen, is door de COVID-19 crisis overduidelijk in beeld gekomen. • Nederland zet in op de ontwikkeling van een eenduidige strategie, waarin meerdere essentiële sectoren met elkaar worden verbonden. Dit moet leiden

	tot een meer onafhankelijke positie ten opzichte van derde landen bij medicijnproductie. • Nederland vindt het belangrijk dat de discussie breed wordt gevoerd en dat het beleid rond geneesmiddelen wordt verbonden aan het Economisch herstelplan, alsmede aan de langetermijnstrategie voor de industrie. • Nederland vindt het belangrijk dat de Europese Commissie een sterke coördinerende rol krijgt toegewezen door de Raad, gevoed door de visie van de diverse lidstaten. Maatregelen ten aanzien van de gezondheid zijn uiteindelijk voorbehouden aan de lidstaten, waardoor de Europese Commissie geen eenduidig beleid kan afdwingen. Hierdoor is het ten aanzien van een geneesmiddelenstrategie van essentieel belang dat alle lidstaten samenwerken en de positieve uitwerking hiervan voor de gezondheidszorg in eigen land terugzien.

Factsheet Financiering patiëntenzorg in Duitsland 12-05-2020

Onderwerp: financiering zorg van Nlse patiënten in Duitse ziekenhuizen	
Kernboodschap (REACTIEF)	- The plan to cover the costs of European patients who have been treated in Germany because of Covid-19 is very noble. I thank you for this gesture of solidarity as neighbouring country. - Moreover, I want to thank you for your intention to cover the costs of foreign Covid-19 patients in Germany. However, we are already grateful for your support in the form of healthcare capacity, which is currently a bigger challenge for the Netherlands than financing healthcare.
Argumentatie	- Er is tot nu toe geen officieel aanbod gedaan aan Nederland over het dekken van de zorgkosten in Duitsland. Dit voorstel vereist een wetswijziging en wordt momenteel besproken in het Duitse parlement. - Bij ons is niet bekend hoe Italië en Frankrijk — de andere landen met patiënten in Duitsland — op een dergelijk aanbod zullen reageren. Als Spahn het onderwerp van financiering bespreekt, raden we u aan hem te bedanken en nog geen definitief antwoord te geven. - Gezien de duidelijke inzet van min FIN binnen de EU rondom steunfinanciering lijkt het ons beter om zelf onze broekriem op te houden, we hebben de financiële steun niet per se nodig (in tegenstelling tot de zorgcapaciteit). Diplomatiek verwachten we geen negatieve waardering vanuit Duitsland.

Feiten & cijfers	- Op 20 april is in de media en op de homepage van het Duitse ministerie van Volksgezondheid vermeld dat Duitsland op federaal niveau de kosten zal dekken voor buitenlandse Covid-19 patiënten die vanwege capaciteitsproblemen naar Duitsland kwamen. Dit betreft behandelingen die starten voor 30 september 2020. - Volgens het wetsvoorstel verwacht Duitsland kosten van ongeveer 15 miljoen euro.

Kernboodschap	- The Netherlands is very grateful for the help it has received from Germany, especially North Rhine-Westphalia, when German hospitals accepted Dutch Covid-19-patients in their intensive-care-units when at that time the necessary treatment could not be carried out in the Netherlands. - We would also welcome a continuous collaboration in the future, for example in the event of a possible second wave of Covid-19. During which we can rely on the hospital and IC capacity of each other, might the need arise. - The friendship and close collaboration we are experiencing in different areas in the fight against Covid-19 shows how important our countries are to each other.

Onderwerp: Onderzoek nav COVID-19	
Kernboodschap	- We believe we've now entered an important new phase on COVID-19 research, in which coordination is key. Looking back it's no surprise that in the early weeks of the pandemic national governments set their own research-agenda and financing instruments. However, addressing the overlap and gaps is crucial now that the European Commission takes up its role as coordinator. - This pandemic is unprecedented in all kind of respects. For the first time in history the concept of open science is really setting the standard. Networks of scientists work constantly around the globe to analyze and find pieces of this complex puzzle. It's important that data and information should be FAIR: Findable, Accessible, Interoperable and Re-usable. Only in this way, we can build a research community that will be able to tackle this challenge. - I'm glad to see that the giga-program Horizon 2020 shows on the one hand the flexibility to respond to the societal and research needs that are urgent at this moment. On the other hand that 1 billion research funding can be found in the programme itself (underspending and re-allocation).

Overig	<u>Andere onderzoeksgelden (voor vaccin)</u> - Duitsland draagt 160 mln bij aan CEPI (Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations) voor de ontwikkeling van een Covid-19 vaccin. - Daarnaast heeft afgelopen maandag de Federale minister Karliczek van Onderzoek & Onderwijs (CDU) een 'groot programma' aangekondigd om de

	productiecapaciteit voor een toekomstig vaccin tegen Covid-19 veilig te stellen. • Hiervoor stelt de Duitse regering aanvullend 750 mln beschikbaar: ○ 500 mln voor onderzoek en ontwikkeling van vaccins; en ○ 250 mln voor het voorbereiden dat grote hoeveelheden kunnen worden geproduceerd zodra er een vaccin is gevonden. Hierbij gaat het bijvoorbeeld om de inkoop van ingrediënten of contracten met dienstverleners die vervolgens de vaccins vullen.

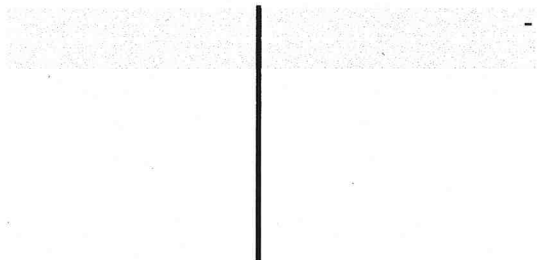

Zij is ook altijd betrokken geweest (samen met mij als achtervang) bij contacten tussen onze bwps en Duitse bwps. We hebben zo ver als ik weet nog geen 'officieel aanbod' gehad van Duitsland voor het dekken van de kosten. 10.2.e is momenteel met verlof.

Ik heb zelf de repatriëring van overledenen georganiseerd en dekking afgesproken (met mandaat van 10.2.e) in overleg met LCPS en ZN. Dit valt niet onder kosten die Duitsland zou dekken.

Het besluit om wel of niet in te gaan op aanbod Duitsland is nog niet genomen (noch voorgelegd aan de bewindspersonen). Momenteel was ons standpunt om het voor te leggen als er een *officieel aanbod* is. In gaan op de financiering zouden we ontraden, omdat geld niet het probleem is. Wel de capaciteit. Vooralsnog is het onduidelijk of het niet aannemen van de financiering ook praktisch werkbaar is in Duitsland. Dit is afhankelijk van hoe zij de compensatie van buitenlandse patiënten inregelen binnen de zorg. Op 15 juni zal min MZS naar Duitsland gaan om te bedanken voor inzet rondom IC capaciteit in NRW (met Hollandse Nieuwe voor hele ziekenhuis). Met 10.2.e van DCO (in cc) heb ik hier al contact over gehad. Organisatie van bezoek staat nog in de stijgers.

We hebben dus nog niks richting Duitsland gecommuniceerd, omdat er ook tussen de landen nog geen officieel verzoek is gekomen. Ik zou dus nog niks hierover delen met NU. Mogelijk is na het bezoek de 15^e een goed moment om hierop terug te komen? Geeft dit genoeg informatie?
